About Jordan Boyd

Jordan Boyd was born on May 23, 1997 and tragically passed away on August 12, 2013. Jordan grew up in Bedford, Nova Scotia and attended Sunnyside Elementary School, Eaglewood Elementary School, and Bedford Junior High School. In grade 10, Jordan attended Rothesay Netherwood School in Rothesay, New Brunswick. Jordan was the son of Stephen and Deborah Boyd and has two older sisters, Kelsey and Jillian, and one older brother Greg, maternal and paternal grandparents, seven aunts and uncles, and many cousins, all of whom he loved dearly. At the time of his passing, Jordan was playing hockey, attending the training camp of the Acadie-Bathurst Titan's training camp, having been drafted by them in the 2013 QMJHL Entry Draft, an accomplishment he was very proud of yet at the same time very humble about.

About the Jordan Boyd Leadership Award

The Jordan Boyd Leadership Award was established in the Fall of 2013 by the family of Jordan Boyd, with the generous assistance of the local community, to honor and remember a special young man.

Jordan Boyd was well known in the Bedford community and the Atlantic hockey community. He had a very broad and diverse group of friends. Jordan's friends describe him as fun, uplifting, kind, loyal, generous, humble, the fixer who would pick up a friend who was having a bad day, and as the guy who would stand up to others who were being unkind. To his family Jordan was the baby of the family, a loving son, and brother. His family was immensely important to Jordan as he was to them, who are extremely proud of Jordan and the fine young man he grew into. Jordan was known for his smile which would light up a room, something which everyone commented on.

The kinds of qualities that are being sought in Leadership Award applicants are those which in many ways reflect what was important to Jordan. They include demonstration of:

- 1) **Character.** Is the applicant a positive role model for their peers and family? Do they try to have positive relations with others and are they a positive contributor to their family and larger community?

- 2) **Work ethic.** Do they demonstrate a positive work ethic? Do they try to do well in the things they tackle in life such as school, part-time jobs, athletics, etc. This doesn't mean they need to be an "A" student or a star athlete, it really is about - do they try to do their best?
- 3) **Kindness.** Are they a friend when someone needs help? Do they do volunteer work or other acts that are done to make the community or another person's situation better?
